National President Report Autumn 2024

Dear Members,

As I put pen to paper my thoughts are with those of you across Australia affected by the weather events we have been contending with. While even the most loyal and proud Australians amongst us sometimes find it hard in times like these to love our sunburnt country with its drought and flooding rains, your courage and resilience shines through, as does the friendship and generosity of those more fortunate. Despite everything that Mother Nature may have thrown at you, I hope you managed to celebrate Christmas and New Year with your loved ones.

As a New Year is upon us your National Council is looking forward to planning for the year ahead. We are excited to be planning for our inaugural National War Widows Day on 19 October this year. Letters have been sent to the Ministers/representatives for Veterans Affairs in Victoria, Tasmania and NT to inform them of this event and to ask for their support. At present there are no formal Australian War Widow Groups in these states, and we would really like them to celebrate with us.

It was great for many of us to have a break over the Festive Season and recharge our batteries. Now that we have welcomed in the new year the various representative groups that I attend on your behalf will reconvene and the first meetings for the year have been scheduled.

I attend a number of these groups including ADSO (Alliance of Defence Ex-Service Organisations, ESORT (Ex-Service Organisation Round Table), OWP

(Operational Working Party) NACCF (National Aged Care Community Forum) and seek your input into any issues you may like raised at these meetings. Our Council members have been busy representing AWW at various events. Robynne Mitchell and Rhondda Vanzella attended the dedication of the Keith Payne VC Rest Area at Pheasant's Nest NSW on 13 November 2023. We held a very productive AGM on 21 November 2023. I continue to represent AWW on the Editorial Committee for Veterans MATES and Maria Barclay from AWW SA attends a Veterans MATES consultative group in Adelaide.

I am pleased to report some matters from the ESORT meeting I attended at DVA Canberra in December. Minister Keogh was present and discussed key priorities including consultation on the legislative reform pathway to produce a better simpler system of compensation. Secretary Alison Frame acknowledged the emerging priority of Aged Care issues. DVA is continuing to work to improve support for veterans transitioning to, and living in, aged care facilities.

On 11 December 2023, I attended a Residential Aged Care workshop with DVA staff and relevant stakeholders to discuss gaps in Residential Aged Care service delivery to Veterans and War Widows, and to find a way to provide a more seamless service. Issues around hearing aids remain an area where DVA is working to ensure veterans' needs are addressed.

Thank you to all those who attended and/or laid wreaths at Remembrance Day Services. We must always remember and acknowledge those who were prepared to give their lives for their country.

Until next time, stay safe and cool, keep your vaccinations up to date and I look forward to hearing from you if you have any issues you need addressed.

#### **COCONUT DAINTIES**

Add egg.


Stir in flour, then coconut.

#### WAR WIDOWS ENTITLEMENTS

The War Widows Association is built on the footprints of our Founder, Mrs Jessie Vasey.

In 1945, Mrs Vasey identified that many widows of the fallen were living in sub-standard conditions, some homeless and many unable to feed their father-less children.

From that day forward, Mrs Vasey fought the Government to improve conditions and payments for those women, who, already having suffered a terrible loss, were living in near poverty. Mrs Vasey took it upon herself to remind the Government of their promise made to the men who enlisted, that their widows and children would be cared for.

The campaigns, under Mrs Vasey's leadership achieved the introduction of several entitlements that we currently have access to, including inclusion of the tax-exempt pensions, increased pensions, concessions, income supplements, medical entitlements etc.

The ethos of Mrs Vasey's legacy continues as the War Widows Association (SA) Inc., lobbies Government to ensure all entitlements continue if/when a war widow enters residential aged care.

Currently, Aged Care Providers deliver inconsistent services to our veteran/war widow community because they do not have to honour respective Veteran/Military legislation, they only comply with the Aged Care Act 1997. That is the reason we need to ensure the new one, which will be effective from 01 July 2024 cross references our own Acts.

We have examples of some veterans and war widows' entitlements under their Gold Treatment Cards being reduced and/or not honoured by residential care facilities.

If you consider that this issue is important and/or would like to support our efforts in protecting our entitlements to services when in residential aged care, **PLEASE consider contacting the Department of Health and Aged Care with feedback.** As an example:

'I/WE REQUEST THE GOVERNMENT PLACE VETERANS AND WAR WIDOWS AS A STAND-ALONE GROUP WITHIN THE NEW AGED CARE ACT' AND THERE IS NO REDUCTION OR LOSS OF ENTITLEMENTS UNDER CURRENT VETERAN LEGISLATION.

#### <u>Green Practices for</u> Commemorative Events

Some materials commonly used in wreaths and tributes, such as plastics and non-biodegradable products, pose a significant environmental threat. These materials do not break down and contribute to pollution, which contradicts our duty to leave a healthy planet for our families and future generations.

Recognising this, the Australian War Widows of South Australia took a commendable step last year by adopting a policy to utilize only tribute books for charitable purposes or locally sourced cut flowers without harmful foam backing and wires. This initiative mirrors the sustainable approach taken during the coronation of King Charles III in 2023, where only local cut flowers were used, aligning with the policy that only organic or compostable material should be laid in tribute.

You can also use locally sourced cut flowers, free of harmful foam backing and wires, and explore other organic or compostable materials for creating wreathes and tributes.
